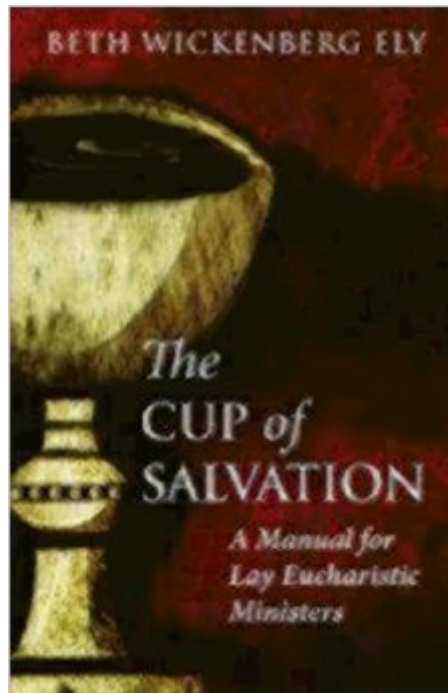

This is an ideal book for anyone planning on becoming a Eucharistic Minister. Note, it does not address Eucharistic Visitors. This is also a ideal book for use in ongoing EM education and training. Beth writes in such a way as to explain every detail but does not talk down to those new to this type of liturgical lay ministry. Even for parishioners not planning on becoming EMs, this is a very enjoyable, often humorous, and educational book about a very key role in today's church.
